How can the Disability Navigator help you or someone you know?

If you are a person with a disability who is seeking employment, our Disability Navigators can assist you in finding and obtaining information and services that will support your successful entry or re-entry into the workforce. Some of these may include:

- Connecting with local agencies to assist with your job search
- SSI and SSD
- Social Security Ticket to Work
- Understanding and Utilizing work incentives
- Accessing VESID and ABVI services
- Medicaid Buy-In Options and other Health Care Options
- Obtaining information on Transportation and Housing Services
- Accessing needed work supports
- Understanding unemployment payments effect on your earnings
- Numerous other work-related issues or concerns
